A new community of artists has formed on the main floor of the Edmonton Downtown Farmers Market and the Sculptors' Association of Alberta has found a home in it. The Farmers Market is open year-round on weekends - Friday, Saturday, Sunday in the old Army & Navy Department store on 97 Street, east of the Law Courts building.

The SAA has booked into a booth in the artists' alley for three months starting Oct. 1 until the end of the year. A decision to proceed past this date will depend on SAA artists who wish to participate.

The large eight foot by 16 foot booth now has seven of our artists' works and they are: Jennifer Lang, Kay McCormack, Shawn Olander, Bev Oliwa, Pat Prodaniuk, Ellie Shuster, and Keith Turnbull. The participating artists take turns sitting the booth for its hours of opening - Friday 11-5, Saturday 9-3, and Sunday 11-5 each week.

To draw people to the market, the market has special events on most weekends, and promotes the market on social and other media

As of October 1, the Sculptors' Association of Alberta will have a "permanent" home at the **Edmonton Downtown Farmers Market**! We have booked a space for up to 15 artists to show and sell our work under the SAA banner as part of *Art at the Market*, with a number of other professional artists. I couldn't be more excited!

Our expectation is that sculptors will cycle through as space becomes available. Everyone will share the costs, work their share of sales shifts, contribute 15% of proceeds and present the personality of our Association to Edmontonians and tourists alike. We have committed to Christmas and will consider whether to continue into 2023.



The market fulfills so much of our mandate - building a profile for our art form by engaging visitors with sculpture and the artists who create it, helping to grow our membership, putting funds into the jeans of our sculptors and the coffers of the association itself, and offering SAA some stability.

If you haven't considered the opportunity, there are a few spots left on a firstserved basis. You must be a member in good standing and willing to make a firm commitment. Please contact Maria for more information.

On another note, based on the professionalism and dynamic of our exhibition at Night of Artists and "Creature Comforts" in Drumheller, we have been invited to exhibit at the **Spruce Grove Art Gallery** run by the **Allied Arts Council**. The show will run April 11- May 5, 2023 and is just in the planning. Stay tuned!
